Task Description/Overview
Students are to complete a set of unseen questions based on a set of sources that have been previously supplied.
Detailed Assessment Task Description
Students will be given 40 minutes in class in order to complete a test based on a set of sources that they have been supplied with. All classes are to give the students TWO lessons to analyse the sources, using the Source Analysis table as a guide. Questions for the task are unseen, until sitting the test. To succeed in the assessment, students must do two things; 1. Research the Holocaust by doing as much wide reading as possible (Can't be left to the last minute) 2. Source 1 – Quotes from Heinrich Himmler, at Posen, 6th October 1943.

“I am now referring to the evacuation of the Jews, the extermination of the Jewish people. It's one of those things that is easily said: 'The Jewish people are being exterminated', says every party member, 'this is very obvious, it's in our program, elimination of the Jews, extermination,

“... we had the duty to our people to do it, to kill this people who wanted to kill us.”

“We came to the question: How is it with the women and children? I decided to find a clear solution here as well. I did not consider myself justified **to exterminate the men – in other words, to kill them or have them killed** – and allow the avengers of our sons and grandsons in the form of their children to grow up. The difficult decision had to be taken to make this people disappear from the earth.”
