Task Description/Overview

You are to independently **find, analyse and compare** an appropriate related text to the prescribed text 'Billy Elliot'. You must address the following question:

'Human experiences ignite new ideas about important issues.'

Discuss how this statement explored in prescribed text 'Billy Elliot' and the related text you have chosen?

In your analysis '**Billy Elliot**' and your chosen related text you must choose **ONE** of any of the following themes:

- Gender stereotypes or gender norms
- The impact of traditional values or beliefs
- The search for identity
- Overcoming adversity
- Pursuit of passion
- The importance of sacrifice
- The impact of loss

You will be given **5 periods of class time** to work on this task. The following lessons will be allocated to the completion of the presentation:

Wednesday - Week 7

Friday - Week 8 (Double period)

Monday - Week 9 (Double Period)

You will be given time in those periods to fill in the scaffold and generally plan for the presentation. If your teacher determines that you are not making sufficient progress on your assessment or you do not use the class time effectively, these periods **will be revoked**.

NOTE: The related text that you choose cannot be a prescribed text listed under any of the HSC English courses. Also, it cannot be a text that has been previously taught from Year 7 to 11 English.

Detailed Assessment Task Description

Students must create or deliver a 5 to 8 minute presentation, using appropriate technology in which you:

- Present a brief overview of 'Billy Elliot' and your chosen related text.
- Explain how **BOTH** texts represent your chosen theme and address the question ensuring that you provide examples from your related text.
- You must select key extracts, examples or evidence from your related text and 'Billy Elliot' and **ANALYSE** them in reference to the question.
- As it is a presentation, you must engage your audience through rhetorical devices and different **MODES**. **It must be an engaging presentation.**

You will be assessed on:

- How you demonstrate an understanding of the ways specific human experiences are represented in your related text.
- Using different **MODES to present arguments**. This includes: Reading and Writing, Viewing and Representing **PLUS** Speaking – using **YOUR OWN VOICE**. **(It cannot be computer generated)**
- Using language and technology to communicate ideas in an engaging manner, appropriate to audience, purpose and context.

Your presentation must use one of the following platforms:

- Microsoft PowerPoint
- Prezi or Google Slides (this must be presented **LIVE** in class)
- Video Presentation
- Sway
- Website or Wix
- Live Presentation with an engaging platform of your choice.
- Keynote

Any other platforms must be run by and approved by your teacher.

You must also submit a transcript of the spoken information presented in your multimodal presentation in the form of a word document along with your presentation.

Submission:

The task is to be submitted on CANVAS. **It must be submitted by 8:25am on Monday the 11th of December.**
