SERIES PHOTOGRAPHS (18 Marks)				
Students were given the opportunity to take photographs of portraits using a digital camera				

and utilising the portrait techniques they learned in class. They need to consider composition, camera angle, lighting and pose.

Submit **SIX** of their best photographs.

All photographs need to be originals – students' own images.

APPROPRIATION PORTRAIT IMAGES (12 Marks)

Students investigated the photographs of various artists who used appropriation in their work. They explored three different ways of appropriating images to create their own artwork.

Use the appropriated images provided to create your own photo collages.

Submit **THREE** appropriated portraits.

Images should be hard copies.
