Task Description/Overview
Students are required to view an unseen text, identify and explain examples of different modes. Students will also evaluate how specific themes are conveyed in the multimodal text and compare those themes to the prescribed film <i>Searching</i> .
The given time to complete the task is 75 minutes.
Detailed Task Description
Section One: Preparatory modes table (10 marks) Students will view or read an unseen multimodal text then fill in a table where they identify key examples of <u>each</u> of the different modes and explain their effects. This will be modelled in class.
Section Two: Responding to unseen text (20 marks) Students will then respond to an essay question which will require them to <u>evaluate</u> TWO modes in both the unseen text and <i>Searching</i> . This response will require students to compare or contrast how effective the modes are at manipulating, shaping or persuading a responder's thoughts or ideas of a theme studied throughout the term.
The two modes and the theme will be provided in the essay question on the day of the task.
