#### Task Description/Overview

Students will be required to complete the HSC Trial Examinations. There will be TWO examinations that test students' knowledge of course content throughout the year.

#### **Detailed Assessment Task Description**

# <u>Paper One – Texts and Human Experiences</u> (1 hour and 30 minutes + 10 minutes reading time)

- i) Students will engage with a variety of unseen texts that deal with the concept of Human Experiences. They will then complete a range of short answer questions.
- **ii)** Students will then complete **ONE** extended response that communicates their knowledge of their prescribed text, **'1984'**.

### <u>Paper Two – Modules</u> (2 hours + 5 minutes reading time)

- i) Module A Textual Conversations: Students will complete ONE extended response based on their understanding of *King Richard III* and *Looking For Richard*.
- ii) Module B Critical Study of Literature: Students will compose ONE extended response based on their prescribed text, 'T.S. Eliot: Selected Poems.'
- iii) Module C Craft of Writing This section will be in TWO parts:

**Part One:** Students use the stimulus to produce either a creative, discursive or persuasive text.

**Part Two:** Students reflect on the creative choices implemented in **PART ONE**, evaluating their choices in form, features and vocabulary. Students should also demonstrate a thorough knowledge of the prescribed texts in Module C.

NOTE: Due to the unseen nature of the examination questions, marking criteria cannot be provided.
