Task Description/Overview

Students will compose a synthesis essay in which they compare and contrast how the concepts of language, identity and culture are explored in their prescribed text: **The Anthology of Contemporary Asian Australian Poets.**

Detailed Assessment Task Description

You must write a synthesis essay in response to the following question:

"Analyse how language creates a sense of identity for individuals within a community"

In your response, make close reference to **THREE** poems, using detailed evidence and analysis from your selected poems.

You can select from the following poems:

- 'This is Where it Begins' by Merlinda Bobis
- 'New Accents' by Ouyang Yu
- 'Mother' by Vuong Pham
- 'Translucent Jade' by Maureen Ten

Writing the Response

Students will use their knowledge of Module A to complete the essay question. **NO** resources/notes will be permitted during this assessment and students will have **ONE PERIOD** of writing time. Students are expected to organise their responses using the structure taught in class, paying particular attention to the **SETEL/STEEL** paragraph structure.
