Task Description/Overview

Your assessment will be in two parts.

Part A: You are to create a 5-8 minute multimedia presentation for Médecins Sans Frontiers (Doctors Without Borders) informing their staff on how to ethically treat a Hindu patient.

Part B: You are to write a paragraph of no less than 200 words, discussing the way in which Hindu ethics have impacted on India's Covid19 response.

A bibliography should also be submitted, showing any resources you have used in completing Part A and B. Your bibliography should be in HARVARD or MLA format.

Part A and B (plus bibliography) are both to be submitted on CANVAS by 8:25am on the due date.

Failure to submit on time will result in a mark of zero being awarded unless an illness/misadventure form is submitted and approved.

Detailed Assessment Task Description Part A (20 marks):

In creating your 3-5minute multimedia presentation, you should aim to inform Médecins Sans Frontiers staff on the following:

- Religious practices patients are likely to engage in while in care
- Hygiene requirements
- Dietary requirements
- Decision making
- End of life considerations (procedures after death)
- Holy days
- Organ donation
- Life preserving measures
- Sexual and reproductive health
- Pain Management

You can create your multimedia presentation using any appropriate program, however, it must be submitted as an MP4 file.

You may include short clips from other sources in your presentation if you choose, however they should not take up any more than 20% of the total length of your presentation.

Part B (10marks):

Examine how the Hindu belief system has impacted the Indian governments Covid19 response. In your response, consider how social aspects of the belief system have impacted different Hindi's in different ways.

Your response should follow formal essay structure and be no less than 200 words in length. It should be submitted to canvas alongside Part A in either word or pdf format.
