2) <b>Perform</b> your composition.

You need to choose to compose and perform either Level 1, 2 or 3.

The maximum number of marks will be in line with your choice of difficulty. Option 1 – Sound. Maximum Performance mark 6/10. Maximum Composition Mark 6/10.

**Option 2 – High.** Maximum Performance mark 8/10. Maximum Composition Mark 8/10

**Option 3 – Outstanding.** Maximum Performance mark 10/10. Maximum Composition Mark 10/10
